Update: CCPECP (Coordinating Chamber for PSCBC - Eastern Cape Province Annual General Meeting (AGM) – 15 November 2024

The PSA, acting together with UNIPSAWU and NPSWU, represent 17 857 members with a vote weight of 15.21%. This places the PSA in the third position and to remain a leading Union, shop stewards, structure members, and members are called upon to assist in ensuring Union growth by recruiting new members for the PSA.

Elections: Chamber Management

Elections of the Chamber Management were concluded, and the following officials were re-elected:

- Mr T Koya Chairperson (Labour)
- Mr Fitoyi Vice-Chairperson (Labour)
- Ms L Sigabi Vice Chairperson (Employer)

Labour chose to re-elect these officials owing to the short term of office. It was agreed that maintaining continuity in leadership helps avoid disruptions and ensures the smooth functioning of this well-coordinated Chamber. The employer echoed the same sentiments. The AGM was followed by a CCPECP Chamber meeting, which discussed the following agenda items:

- Human Resource Management status report
- Draft OHS resolution

Both items were not discussed but deferred to the next meeting as the employer needed to consolidate the reports and input from other departments. The meeting resolved to reduce oral responses to writing and be handed to the Chamber secretariat by 21 November 2024. The PSA noted the undertaking by the employer and expressed dissatisfaction with the non-submission of the written report.

Regarding the draft OHS resolution, parties were requested to submit their inputs to the Chamber secretariat. The PSA submitted inputs on 18 November 2024.

The next meeting is scheduled for 13 February 2025 and members are requested to furnish the PSA with issues they would want the PSA to table at the next meeting in addressing matters of mutual interest.
